Will you please let me know what

your ruling is in the following case:

a paper is read & diecursed at a meeting. Some one makes remarks devogatory to the paper & author. Owing & lack y time at the end of the meeting the author has not the opportunity & reply in his depense, y is asked & do so in writing.

Before the discussion is perinted the descussion finds that he was mistaken & wishes & withdraw his remarks. If this is allowed, the author has no chance & depend him - self, & those who heard the verbal discussion will be left under the impression that the author was in error, which may be the lime.

If you have no valing for such a case, may I suggest that you vale that the author may then, in his final written, closing, discussion, re-state the criticism without mentioning the name of the discussor, & areaver it. In that can the author, when asked to propan his final written closing discussion, should be given a complete copy of the stenographer's record with the editors marks showing what has been cut out by him a others.

The verbal presentation of the paper, in brig abstract, may certain clauses or expressions not certained in his paper; this I undirationed is not taken down sterrographically nor printed. A discussor may refer to such clauses, & therefore also the author in his pinal reply.
