DR. S. Z. de FERRANTI

Adopted By Board of Directors  
of A.I.E.E. - January 29, 1930.

The Board of Directors of the American Institute of Electrical Engineers desires to record in its minutes a tribute to the memory of Dr. Sebastian Ziani de Ferranti, a member of the Institute since 1903 and Honorary Member since 1912, who died on January 13, 1930.

Dr. de Ferranti, a man of delightful personality, was an outstanding pioneer in engineering, having begun work in this field at the age of about 13, and made important developments in several types of electrical equipment while very young. He was one of the first to propose high voltage transmission of power, and his achievements in the development of the necessary equipment, as well as other electrical apparatus, are widely known and appreciated. During his entire career of continual effort and accomplishment, he exhibited marked ability as an inventor, a designer, and a manufacturer, which won him an international reputation.

It is, therefore, with a sincere appreciation of the great loss sustained by the engineering profession and the Institute that the Board of Directors hereby extends deepest sympathy to his family and associates.
