DEATH OF MRS. S. SHELDON.

Brooklyn, N. Y., Woman Passes Away in Middlebury Hotel.

Middlebury, July 9.—Frances (Putnam) Sheldon, wife of Dr. Samuel Sheldon, professor at the Brooklyn, N. Y., Polytechnic institute, died in her rooms at the Addison house at 2.30 o'clock this morning after an illness of several months. Mrs. Sheldon came to Middlebury about six weeks ago and up to Monday night had been improving. Since then she had weakened rapidly.

Besides her husband and son, Samuel Sheldon, jr., she is survived by a nephew, Charles Colvin Putnam, controller of the Brooklyn Savings bank, Brooklyn, N. Y., and two nieces, Mrs. L. W. T. Coleman of New York city and Mrs. James E. Edwards of Englewood, N. J.

Dr. and Mrs. Sheldon have been coming to Middlebury during the past 16 years. Dr. Sheldon graduated from Middlebury college in the class of 1883. He has won distinction in electrical science and is a professor of kindred subjects at the Brooklyn Polytechnic institute.

Mrs. Sheldon's funeral will be held on Saturday afternoon at 2 o'clock. The services will be conducted at the Addison house by Rev. John Evans Bold, pastor of St. Stephen's Episcopal church. The burial will take place in the family plot in the West cemetery.
