From the Internet: PHB is a German aerial wire cable lift firm from Cologne. The origins of the company stretch back to the year 1926, when Ernst Heckel founded a machine factory and an iron and steel foundary in Rohrbach.

A merger in 1962 gave birth to the company *PHB* - *Pohlig Heckel Bleichert Vereinigte Maschinenfabriken AG*, bringing three internationally active enterprises under a single management.

In one of the papers that follow, Constam says he has built aerial trams since 1926, so he was either active in PHB or identified with PHB in some way. The two earliest PHB lifts listed go back to 1912, so one of the other partners must have built those.

Evidently, along with many of the big aerial tramways of Europe. They also list known Constam J-bars and T-bars from the earliest one at Davos in 1934 onward to include the J-bars Pabst put up in New Hampshre (even though Pabst built them himself.) The Pabst lifts are listed under "licensees." I assume PHB also built lifts by designers other than Constam. Within the pages of this PHB brochure are a series of lists that included the early Constam J-bars and T-bars.in Europe.
