Edward Barnard Meyer, a native of New Jersey, a graduate of this Institute in the Class of 1903 in electrical engineering, a pioneer in developing improved methods and systems of underground power transmission and distribution; for many years in responsible charge of engineering for the Public Service Companies of New Jersey; early in his career, associated with the activities of the American Institute of Electrical Engineers and, after filling many offices of honor and trust, in 1935 elected President of this body; an active participant in the affairs of the National Electrical Light Association and recently elected President of the New York Electrical Society; a contributor of his services as consultant, during the World War, in important electrical engineering research for the Army and Navy; a writer of authoritative articles and books in his chosen field; a devoted alumnus, alive to the interests of this School and its work.
