Dear Mr. Bailey:

The Executive Committee of the Kansas City Section has received a petition from Hugh G. Swift (M/47) in behalf of IRE members residing in the area of Wichita, Kansas, requesting the formation of a Wichita Sub-Section. We have determined that the required number of twenty (20) bona-fide signatures are affixed. The original petition is enclosed for your inspection and records.

On April 8, 1952, the Executive Committee of the Kansas City Section met with a quorum present and considered the petition as received from Mr. Swift. We unanimously approved the following:

1. That the petition be accepted and approved.
2. That the territory of the Wichita Sub-Section be established as indicated on the enclosed city-county map of the State of Kansas.
3. That a membership rebate of seventy cents (.70) per member will be paid by the Kansas City Section to the Wichita Sub-Section for all IRE members, except students, whose mailing address is within the geographical boundaries as set forth under (2) above.
4. That a loan of \$25.00 will be made from the treasury of the Kansas City Section to the Wichita Sub-Section immediately upon approval by the Executive Committee of the Institute.

In the letter of transmittal, Mr. Swift indicated his desire to expedite final approval by the Executive Committee of the Institute in order that officers could be elected before the end of the current meeting year. It is understandable that this would be desirable so the Sub-Section committees could be appointed and preparations made during the summer months for the fall meetings. Therefore, I will greatly appreciate your cooperation if you will bring the matter before the Executive Committee of the Institute at your earliest opportunity, then advise me promptly of their decision.



The Executive Committee of the Kansas City Section has received a petition from Hugh G. Swift (M/47) in behalf of IRE members residing in the area of Wichita, Kansas, requesting the formation of a Wichita Sub-Section. We have determined that the required number of twenty (20) bona-fide signatures are affixed. The original petition is enclosed for your inspection and records.

## EXTRACT FROM THE CONSTITUTION

### ARTICLE IX.

#### INSTITUTE SECTIONS AND BRANCHES

54. Whenever, in the judgment of the Board of Directors, a sufficient number of Fellows, Members and Associates shall petition, in writing, these members may form, subject to the Constitution and all By-laws and regulations which may be hereafter prescribed by the Board of Directors, a Section organization for the purpose of more effectually carrying out the aims of the INSTITUTE.

#### EXTRACTS FROM THE BY-LAWS

SEC. 36. A petition for the formation of a Section shall be signed by not less than 25 members residing within the territorial limits hereinafter prescribed. The Board of Directors may decline to authorize the formation of a Section when in its judgment such an organization would not be compatible with the interests of the INSTITUTE.

SEC. 37. In the initial Section organization only petitioners shall have the right to vote.

SEC. 41. The territory of a Section shall include the locality naturally tributary thereto, but shall not include territory so remote or inaccessible that members cannot readily attend meetings. For the purpose of determining the maximum amount to which a Section is entitled under these By-laws, points more than sixty miles from the regular meeting place of the Section shall not be considered a part of that Section, except that, when special conditions warrant such action, additional territory within a reasonable distance may be authorized by the Board of Directors, upon approval of the Sections and Finance Committees. If adjacent Sections are so situated that the sixty-mile limit embraces common territory, the question as to which Section may claim such members as reside within this common territory shall if possible be decided by agreement between the Sections concerned, otherwise by the Sections Committee.

SEC. 42. In addition to INSTITUTE members the Section by-laws may admit other persons interested in engineering, who shall have all the Section privileges except those of voting and holding office.

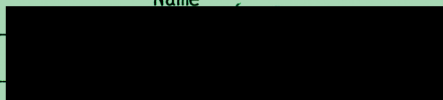
