Colorado Science Olympiad

"U.S. Kids worst in Math Test - Poor performance in six-nation exam of 'grave concern'." This headline was on the front page of the Denver Post, Colorado Living section, February 1, 1989.

Aren't you troubled by the overwhelming evidence of America's future adults declining knowledge of math & science? What can you do as a responsible citizen to reverst that trend?

Last year, it cost us over \$6,000 to support 400 students at the State event. Monies go for; 1) Promotion, 2) Training teachers, captains, judges and volunteers, 3) Tournament facilities and materials, 4) Awards.
