HISTORY OF THE MEMPHIS SECTION

The Memphis Section was organized on May 22, 1930, by a group of electrical engineers who were members of AIEE. The Section was one of several which comprised the Southern District Number Four. The first chairman was Mark Eldredge, who has continued to be active in AIEE since leaving Memphis in 1940 and is now retired and living in California. He was formerly with the Memphis Power and Light Company and was very instrumental in the early development of the Section.

The territory of the Section in the early days extended from the Kentucky line on the north to Jackson, Mississippi on the south and from Nashville, Tennessee on the east to Little Rock, Arkansas on the west. As industry grew in this area and the membership increased, these boundaries have drawn closer to Memphis. The Memphis Section was instrumental in forming the Muscle Shoals (1938), Arkansas (1947), Nashville (1951), and Mississippi (1951) sections as the membership in the respective areas increased to the minimum to allow them to obtain Section status. The present territory of the Memphis Section comprises the State of Tennessee from the Tennessee River, eight counties of north Mississippi and seven counties of east Arkansas.

In 1957 the Memphis Section and Christian Brothers College, after many months of negotiating with Headquarters, formed a Student Branch of AIFE. This student branch has been a very active organization under the guidance of Brother Lawrence Philip and in 1961 was the third largest AIFE student branch in the institute. During the past year a Student Branch has been formed at Memphis State University and is expected to grow with the same rapid growth as the Engineering School at Memphis State.

To provide for greater benefit from AIEE to its members living remote from Memphis, the Section established the Jackson (Tenn.) Subsection in 1957. There were approximately 26 members in the subsection and regular monthly meetings are held similarly to those of the parent section.

In 1959 District 4 was divided in half, thus creating a new District 13 in which the Memphis Section was located. Included in this territory were 12 Sections, 6 subsections and 12 student branches. The total membership excluding students was approximately 2500 members.

The Institute of Radio Engineers (IRE) in Memphis was a subsection of the Huntsville Section. The subsection was organized in 1959 and was active until the merger. They gave support to organization of the Engineering in Medicine and Biology Group.

The Memphis Section was host to the 1962 South Central District Meeting. This was the first meeting of the District since the split of the original District 4 and was a very successful three-day meeting with a total attendance of 479 members and guests.

After many months of discussions, the American Institute of Flectrical and Electronics Engineers (AIEE) and the Institute of Radio Engineers (IRE) merged, effective January 1, 1964, to form the Institute of Electrical and Electronics Engineers (IEFE). After this merger, the Memphis Section became a Section of Region III (Southeastern) which presently comprises 38 Sections, 12 Subsections, and approximately 14,000 members. In addition to the Jackson Subsection, the Memphis Section has promoted the Power and Engineering in Medicine and Biology Group Chapters.

The Section throughout its 30 odd years has been an active and progressive technical organization holding monthly meetings with programs selected to satisfy the interest of as many members as possible. For several years technical discussion groups have been in operation to provide for monthly discussions on specific interest in the field of transmission and distribution and bio-medical electronics.

The Section supports the Region III Student activities through an annual financial contribution and also gives financial support to the annual Engineers' Week program. Each year's bound volumes of the AIEE Transactions are placed in the Business and Technology Division of the Memphis Public Library.




