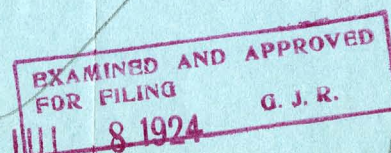
The preparation of a resolution of sympathy for the family of our late friend, T. C. Martin, has been entrusted to me by the Governors of the Engineers' Club.
