# INSTITUTE OF ELECTRICAL AND ELECTRONICS ENGINEERS MAINE SECTION

BYLAWS - SEPT. 1, 1964

# Article I - NAME

The name of this organization shall be the <u>Maine Section of the Institute</u> of <u>Electrical and Electronics Engineers.</u>

# Article II - PURPOSE

The purpose of this Section shall be to further the aims and ideals of the Institute and to promote the welfare of its own members through the holding of meetings and field trips for the study of subjects of an engineering or scientific nature or of interest and value to the Institute members.

### Article III - TERRITORY

The territory served by this Section shall include the State of Maine in its entirety.

# Article IV - MEMBERSHIP

Section A All members of the IEEE with IEEE mailing addresses within the territory of the Maine Section are automatically members of this Section unless an individual member chooses membership in a contiguous Section in accordance with IEEE Bylaws. Certain other members of IEEE residing in contiguous territory may become members of the Maine Section in accordance with IEEE Bylaws.

Section B All Fellows, Senior Members and Members of the Maine Section shall be entitled to vote and hold office. Associates shall be entitled to vote but not to hold office. Student members shall not have the right to vote nor to hold office.

# Article V - OFFICERS

Section A Officers of the Section shall be a Chairman, Vice-Chairman, Secretary-Treasurer, Assistant Secretary-Treasurer, and two Members-at-Large of the Executive Committee. The Chairman, at the expiration of the term of office for which he is elected, shall as Junior Past Chairman, be a member ex-officio of the Executive Committee for the following year. Members-at-Large shall be elected for a period of two years. All other officers shall hold office for the Section year.

Section B The Section Chairman shall be the executive officer of the Section, assuming the duties and obligations usually pertaining to that office. In his absence his duties shall be performed by the Vice-Chairman, or, in the absence of the Vice Chairman, by any other officer or member of the Executive Committee.

Section C The Section Vice-Chairman shall be the Junior Officer of the Section, assuming the duties and obligations usually pertaining to that office.

Section D The Secretary-Treasurer shall perform the duties and obligations usually pertaining to those offices. He shall, within a reasonable time after

each meeting, report to the Secretary of the Institute the proceedings at all meetings. He shall also render to the Secretary of the Institute an account of such expenditures as are chargeable to the Institute Treasury. Not later than August 15th the accounts of the Secretary-Treasurer shall be subject to audit by a committee of three appointed by the Chairman.

Section E The Assistant Secretary-Treasurer shall assist the Secretary in the conduct of his duties, or the work may be divided between them as may be mutually agreed or as may be designated by the Executive Committee. The Assistant Secretary-Treasurer shall keep the historical record of the activities of the Maine Section.

Section F This Section shall be governed by an Executive Committee consisting of the Chairman, Vice-Chairman, Secretary-Treasurer, Assistant Secretary-Treasurer, the three Chairmen of the Program, Membership, and Public Relations Committees, and two Members-at-Large. All Technical Groups and Group Chapters in the Section shall have representation on the Committee (one person can represent more than one Group or Chapter).

Meetings of the Executive Committee shall be held at the call of the Chairman, or of any three members of the Executive Committee, at such times and in such places as may be designated. Five or more members shall constitute a quorum.

Executive Committee business may be conducted by mail when desirable. Concurrence by at least five members of the Committee shall be required to transact such business.

Section G Any officer may be removed for cause by the Executive Committee at any Executive Meeting upon the vote of at least 75 per cent of the total Executive Committee Membership, provided a motion to that effect shall have been made at a similar meeting at least thirty days previously, and provided that a copy of such motion together with a statement of charges shall have been delivered forthwith to the officer in question. Such officer shall have the right of defense.

Section H Any vacancy occurring within the Executive Committee shall be filled by Executive Committee appointment. Any person so appointed shall hold office until the next succeeding election.

#### Article VI - NOMINATIONS

Section A Not later than January 1st, the Chairman of the Section shall appoint a Nominating Committee of three or more members not then officers of the Section.

Section B The Nominating Committee shall nominate a regular ticket consisting of one candidate each for Chairman, Vice-Chairman, Secretary-Treasurer, Assistant Secretary-Treasurer, and a candidate for the office of Junior Member-at-Large of the Executive Committee.

Section C The Nominating Committee shall guide its actions by the following provisions:

- l. The nominee for the office of Chairman preferably may be the Section Vice-Chairman.
- 2. The nominee for the office of Vice-Chairman preferably may be the Section Secretary-Treasurer.

- 3. The nominee for the office of Secretary-Treasurer shall preferably be chosen from Section members who have served on the Executive Committee.
- 4. Insofar as may be practicable, consideration shall be given to providing an equitable distribution of officers by geographical location and among the professional divisions; namely, communications, education, manufacturing and utility.
- Section D The Section membership shall be notified, not later than February 12 of the nominations made by the Nominating Committee.
- Section E Nominations for any or all offices may be made by petition under the following provisions:
- 1. Such petition or petitions shall bear the personal signature of at least 10 voting members of the Maine Section.
- 2. Such petition or petitions must be delivered to the Secretary-Treasurer not later than April 1.
- 3. The nominee or nominees covered by such petition or petitions shall be included in the regular ballot, and designated as such.

### Article VII - ELECTIONS

Section A If no nominations by petition are received by the Secretary-Treasurer as outlined under Art. VI of these Bylaws, then the intent to elect officers shall be announced to the Section membership in the mailing notice for the May meeting and the election, by voice vote, shall be held at that meeting.

Section B If there develops a contest for any elective office as provided for under Art. VI of these Bylaws, then an election by written ballot shall be announced to the Section Membership as described in Sec. C through F of this Article.

Section C Not later than April 10 of each year, the Secretary-Treasurer shall prepare and mail to each Institute Member of this Section an official ballot, an official ballot envelope and a pre-addressed return envelope. The official ballot shall contain the names of all nominees duly proposed in accordance with these Bylaws.

Section D Only official ballots shall be counted, and to be accepted shall be enclosed in the sealed official ballot envelope. This official ballot envelope shall be enclosed in the sealed outer mailing envelope which must bear the signature of the voting member and which must reach the Secretary-Treasurer not later than 12 o'clock noon, May 1st.

Section E A committee of three or more tellers, members not running for office, shall be appointed by the Section Chairman prior to May 1st of each year. This committee shall receive from the Secretary-Treasurer, unopened, all election ballots received by him in accordance with these Bylaws. The Secretary-Treasurer shall check the name on the outer envelope against the authentic, up-to-date list of the Institute members of the Section, separating unopened, any and all ballots from ineligible persons. These ballots shall not be counted.

The results of the election shall be typed in triplicate, bearing the personal signature of each member of the committee of tellers, together with the date of the count. One such copy shall be delivered by May 15 to the Secretary-Treasurer and one to the Chairman. The third copy shall remain in the possession of the Chairman of the Committee of tellers until after announcement of the election results. The copy delivered to the Secretary-Treasurer shall be retained in the permanent files of the Secretary-Treasurer.

In case of a tie vote for any office, it shall be resolved in favor of one of the candidates so tied by a majority of the votes cast by the members of the Executive Committee to be called immediately after the count of votes by the tellers; a record of such vote shall be entered in the minutes of said meeting of the Executive Committee.

Section F At the first Section meeting after the tellers' report has been received by the Secretary-Treasurer (but no later than the Annual Meeting) the presiding officer shall read the report of the committee of tellers and shall declare duly elected the eligible candidate receiving the greatest number of votes for each office.

Section G Duly elected officers shall assume their official duties on the first day of the Section year next succeeding their election and shall hold office for one year, or until their successors take office. The Secretary-Treasurer shall immediately provide Headquarters with the names and addresses of the new officers.

# Article VIII - COMMITTEES

Section A Standing Committees of this Section shall include:

Program Committee Membership Committee Public Relations Committee

and such other committees as may be required at the discretion of the Executive Committee. The Chairmen of all committees will be appointed by the Section Chairman.

Section B The personnel of any standing or special committee may be appointed by its chairman subject to the discretion of the Executive Committee.

# Article IX - MEETINGS

Section A A minimum of five meetings shall be held during each year at such times and places as may be designated by the Program Committee and approved by the Executive Committee. The Annual Section Meeting and Ladies Day may be held in May or June as desired.

Section B Special Meetings may be called at any time by the Executive Committee upon written notice thereof being sent out in advance of such meeting.

Section C Regular members of this Section shall be notified of the time and place of each Section Meeting and of the subject to be presented. The Student Branches within the Section territory shall also be notified of the time, place, and subject of Section Meetings.

# Article X - DUES

Section A Institute and Student Members shall pay no Section dues.

Section B Persons not members of the Maine Section may have their names placed on the mailing list to receive copies of all meeting notices, etc. upon payment of \$2.00 per year in advance, to cover costs of printing and postage.

# Article XI - GENERAL

Section A Business may be transacted at those Section Meetings where 15 or more Institute Members are present.

Section B A majority shall constitute a quorum at all committee meetings.

Section C In order to provide for proper handling of the Section's routine work and the management of its affairs, the Executive Committee may adopt, in connection with these Bylaws, such rules and regulations as may be found necessary, but no rule or regulation shall be adopted which will conflict with these Bylaws nor with the Constitution and Bylaws of the Institute.

Section D The Section year shall being 1 July and end the following 30 June.

Section E The fiscal year of the Section shall coincide with the calendar year, beginning January 1, 1963.

#### Article XII - SUBSECTIONS

This article is reserved for future Bylaws covering subsections.

#### Article XIII - AMENDMENTS

Section A Proposed Bylaws or changes thereto, and the reasons therefor, shall be mailed to the Section Executive Committee members at least 20 days before the stipulated meeting of the Executive Committee at which the vote shall be taken. Two-thirds of all votes cast at that meeting shall be required to approve any new Bylaws, Amendment or Revocation.

Section B Proposed Bylaws or changes thereto may originate by petition providing that the petition bears the personal signature of at least 20% or 25 members of this Section, whichever is smaller, together with the date of each signature.

# Article XIV - GROUP CHAPTERS

Section A A Chapter of a Group may be promoted by the Section, or by a Group, or by their respective members, by submitting a petition signed by twelve (12) or more members of the Section who are members of or pledge themselves to become members of the Group. The Chapter shall be deemed established after approval of the petition by the Executive Committee of the Section, the Administrative Committee of that Group, and the IEEE Executive Committee.

- Section B All technical meetings sponsored by a Chapter shall be open to all Section members and to all Group Affiliates. No Chapter shall hold such a meeting nor arrange a time and location for that meeting without approval by the Section or by a responsible committee thereof. Notices of technical meetings promoted by a Chapter shall be given to members and Group Affiliates.
- A Chapter shall assist the associated Group in promoting IEEE authorized symposia, regional meetings, etc., in the area of a Section. The Chapter shall be responsible for coordination with the Section on such meetings.
- Section C The Section shall coordinate all meetings proposed by a Chapter with the Section program.
- Section D A Chapter may elect its own chairman and other desired officers. Those elected shall hold the grade of Fellow, Senior Member, or Member.
- Section E A Chapter shall administer and have authority over only such funds as are (1) given to it by the associated Group through the Section Secretary (or Secretary-Treasurer), or (2) allocated to it by the Section Executive Committee or by the District, or by the Region.
- Section F Where there are Section Technical Groups, not associated with any Group Chapters, their activities shall be governed similar to Group Chapters, as set forth in the Section Bylaws in accordance with IEEE Bylaws.

# Article XV - GROUP AFFILIATES

- Section A The Section shall recognize each Group affiliate in good standing, with mailing address within the territory of the Section.
- Section B Each Affiliate so recognized shall receive notices regarding meetings, symposia, conferences, conventions and other pertinent functions and activities of the Group or Groups with which he is affiliated.
- Section C An Affiliate shall be entitled to attend and participate in activities of the Group or Groups with which he is affiliated by payment of the same charges as IEEE members.
- Section D An affiliate is eligible to serve only in appointive offices in the Section relating to activity of the Group or Groups with which he is affiliated.
- Section E An Affiliate shall not be entitled to any other rights or privileges which flow to IEEE members of any grade in the Section nor to vote for any candidate to elective office in the Section including Group activity; nor hold any such elective office.
