



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

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- SEC. 36. A petition for the formation of a Section shall be signed by not less than 25 members residing within the territorial limits hereinafter prescribed. The Board of Directors may decline to authorize the formation of a Section when in its judgment such an organization would not be compatible with the interests of the Institute.
- SEC. 37. In the initial Section organization only petitioners shall have the right to vote.
- SEC. 41. The territory of a Section shall include the locality naturally tributary thereto, but shall not include territory so remote or inaccessible that members cannot readily attend meetings. For the purpose of determining the maximum amount to which a Section is entitled under these By-laws, points more than sixty miles from the regular meeting place of the Section shall not be considered a part of that Section, except that, when special conditions warrant such action, additional territory within a reasonable distance may be authorized by the Board of Directors, upon approval of the Sections and Finance Committees. If adjacent Sections are so situated that the sixty-mile limit embraces common territory, the question as to which Section may claim such members as reside within this common territory shall if possible be decided by agreement between the Sections concerned, otherwise by the Sections Committee.
- SEC. 42. In addition to Institute members the Section bylaws may admit other persons interested in engineering, who shall have all the Section privileges except those of voting and holding office.

YOU WILL ALSO RECALL THAT THE BOARD VOTED THAT THE NECESSARY REGIONAL BOUNDARY CHANGES BE MADE SO THAT ALL OF THE TERRITORY OF THE PROPOSED NEW TULSA SECTION WILL COME WITHIN REGION #6. Dear Mr. Fuller:

I am pleased to advise you that the Board of Directors of the Institute of Radio Engineers approved the petition for the formation of a Tulsa Section of I. R. E. yesterday. This approval is subject to several technicalities, all of which will be taken care of in the very near future. 

Herewith is attached a petition requesting the formation of a Tulsa Section of the Institute of Radio Engineers containing 97 signatures. These signatures are those of 37 members of the Institute,59 applicants and one transfer student.

The area petitioned for by this group includes counties of Oklahoma which are nearer to Tulsa than Oklahoma City. Two borderline counties; Payne, which includes the Oklahoma Institute of Technology at Stillwater, and Kay, which includes Ponca City, have expressed a preference to join the Tulsa Section instead of the Oklahoma City Section, since others of the professional societies have been divided in this manner. Pulaski County in Arkansas is being included at the suggestion of Mr. John D.Reed, Chairman of Region 5. The Kansas counties are included without discussion with the possible members involved since they are in the normal Tulsa trade area.






