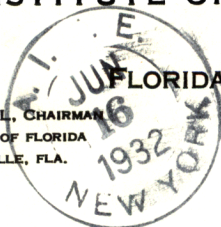



Dear Professor Weil:

I have the honor of notifying you that at the meeting of the Board of Directors held on ~~January 28~~, 1931, the petition for authority to organize a Florida Section of the Institute, to include as its territory the entire State, was approved.

Dear Mr. Lee:

We have received from Professor Joseph Weil, Head of the Department of Electrical Engineering, University of Florida, a letter accompanied by petition forms bearing the signatures of twenty-six members of the Institute who desire to organize a Florida Section, including as its territory the entire state.

Consideration of the organization of such a Section has been under way for the past few years, and I think Vice-President Rodman is thoroughly familiar with the plans. The number of members in Florida at present is approximately forty-five. Those who are active in urging the formation of a Section think that with a Section in that state a considerable number of electrical engineers would join.

In the past, it has been customary for the Chairman of the Sections Committee to report his opinions regarding the desirability of organizing each Section to us, to be referred to the Board of Directors when the petition is considered. Therefore, you may not consider it necessary to refer this to other members of your Committee. The fact that plans were under way to organize a Section was mentioned at the recent Sections Committee meeting. The next meeting of the Board of Directors is to be held on January 28, and if you approve the formation of this Section, we should like to have the petition considered at that time.

Although the number of signatures now available meets the requirements, Professor Weil has requested us to send more petition forms, and expects to send us additional signatures before the date of the Board meeting.

In recent years the Board of Directors has taken a rather liberal attitude in the formation of Sections in locations not having large numbers of members. In case this petition has your support, I have no doubt that the Board will approve.

Dear Mr. Henline:

I am attaching hereto our petition for the formation of what shall be known as the Florida Section of the American Institute of Electrical Engineers. I hope that the Board of Directors can act favorably upon this at their next meeting. I feel that the territory included by this section shall be that of the state of Florida in as much as our membership will be rather scattered and will include members from the entire state.
