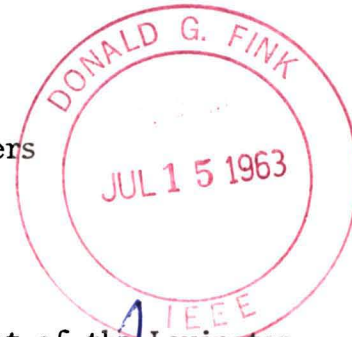



By mutual agreement subsequent to the preparation of the original map these counties were ceded to the Ohio Valley Section of Region II as the community interest is more with the adjacent area in West Virginia.

This section will operate under the IEEE constitution in the interim period, pending the anticipated revision of the model constitution which was contained in initial draft form in the draft issue of the section manual.

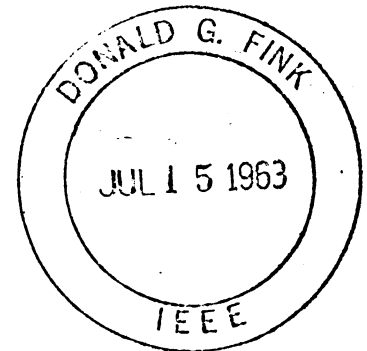

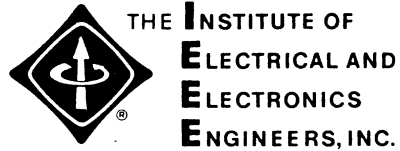
