

The following procedures are proposed for the student publication for September:

1. That the IRE STUDENT QUARTERLY and the AIEE EE Digest be combined in one publication with the same format as SQ.
2. That the cover of the journal bear the name STUDENT QUARTERLY AND EE DIGEST and say "published jointly by the American Institute of Electrical Engineers and the Institute of Radio Engineers," and that the insignia of both societies appear.
3. That the inside front cover carry the joint message from Mr. Haggerty and Dean Teare.
4. That the table-of-contents page contain the same publication and society names as appear on the front cover. The masthead credits for SQ and for EE Digest would be carried separately on this page as shown on the attached. Also, the table of contents will show prominently the location of EE Digest.
5. That the EE Digest, which will be 16 pages, immediately precede the high-school career section. The page order will thus be as follows:
(a) 16 pages IRE articles (including table of contents); (b) 16 pages of EE Digest; (c) 24 pages of career brochure material, and (d) 32 pages of IRE articles. This is a total of 88 pages of material excluding the cover.
6. That AIEE provide camera copy of their 16 pages in the format of SQ to the printer. (IRE)
7. That the requisite number of copies to cover all AIEE student members (about 10,000) will be subtracted from the 20,000 copies of SQ originally scheduled to promote IRE membership.
8. That the remaining promotional copies (approximately 10,000) be available to encourage membership in either society; that these contain both AIEE and IRE Student membership applications; that these promotional copies be addressed in bulk quantities to the IRE Faculty Representatives as in the past; and that letters of explanation be sent out in advance to all IRE Representatives and AIEE Advisors.

The above items, with the exception of the mailing of bulk quantities, have all been discussed with Mr. Leonard and Mr. Mayer of AIEE Headquarters. They concur with these plans.

An objection which might arise from AIEE would concern the career-brochure section. The proposed plan is that no change would be attempted on this section at this late date.

Mr. Hibshman has an article on power available for consideration for the next issue of the student publication.

Student Journal. In view of the opening of colleges in September, it was agreed that immediate steps must be taken with respect to student publications. It was agreed that there should be only one such publication, the Student Journal, that AIEE news would be included in it as soon as possible, that an article on developments in electrical power would be included in the first available issue. The remaining funds in the AIEE Student Publications budget (estimated at \$12,500) would be transferred to IRE to meet additional expenses in publishing the Student Journal. It was further agreed that Student Members of AIEE and IRE would be informed at the opening of school that they would receive the Student Journal upon payment of Student dues, that the Proceedings of the IRE would be available to students at the special subscription rate of \$4.00 for 12 issues, and that Electrical Engineering would be available at a special student rate of \$2.00 for 12 issues. A letter outlining the progress of the merger and stating these arrangements would be printed in the September issue of the Student Journal under the signatures of Presidents Haggerty and Teare. The Secretary agreed to prepare this letter and to acquaint Ted Hunter of the new policy with respect to student publications.
