Professional Activities

Retirement with a secure pension and money in the bank is a financial goal for all our members. Chances are you have moved around, or will be moving. IEEE-USA has been working for many years toward portable pensions. Write three letters - one to each Senator and one to your Congressman within the next two months. Ask them to co-sponsor, support, and vote for H.R. 2390, the Pension and Portability and Improvement Act of 1991.

Pension Portability and Improvement Act of 1991

This legislation requires a minimum contribution of six percent of employees' salaries to be made to the pension plan by employers. We've worked hard to get this bill together and to get it introduced. We need members' support to get it passed.

A hand-written letter is fine — it represents sincere concern. Even if you have a portable pension plan, send the letters anyway, so that other engineers and other U.S. workers can be helped. A lot is at stake, and you can help make some important changes take place.

Tell your Senators and Representative that you are not being merely self-serving. Implementing H.R. 2390 will significantly enhance national savings and will help improve U.S. competitiveness in global markets. Pension funds provide much of the investment capital in this country, and industrial expan-

sion requires capital. Passage of this legislation could be the best 87-cent investment you've ever made in your own and your nation's future.
