Information regarding the IEEE is enclosed. I will be glad to answer any further questions you have concerning the Institute and its activities.

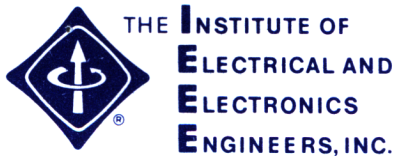

SUBJECT: Transfer of El Paso Area Section (13) IEEE From Region 5 to Region 6.

B. Formal request for Region 5 to 6 Transfer dated August 4, 1986 with Attachments.


1. This letter is a formal request to transfer the El Paso Area Section (13) IEEE from Region 5 to Region 6. Signatures of a few key section personnel in addition to the current Executive Committee signatures are shown below.

2. This is the second formal request for the subject action and is submitted in accordance with the guidelines provided in Ref. A. Ref. B is the first request with associated Attachments providing background justification. We request that a referendum vote be conducted by the IEEE Field Services Center, and that the voting members of this Section be tallied. The results should help form the basis for a decision by the Region 5 and 6 Directors and the IEEE Board of Directors.

3. Attachment 1 of this letter is verification of the El Paso Area Section 1987 election results and the results of the informal survey of members voting on the Region transfer issue. The majority of the members who voted favor the transfer from Region 5 to 6 with eventual separation of the Section to an El Paso and a Las Cruces Section.

4. Reference B, third paragraph delineates the counties in New Mexico and Texas comprising the El Paso Area Section. We propose that the new geographic area be as shown in the sectioned part of the Region Breakdown map provided in Attachment 2 of this letter. The sectioned area includes all of El Paso and Hudsbeth Counties in Texas. The portion of New Mexico that remains in Region 5 includes Hobbs and possibly Clovis.

Dear Mr. Taylor,

At President Pugh's request, this letter will serve to inform you, and through you to all the members of the 1988 Region 6 Committee, that I have been assigned to resolve your concerns regarding the purported request to transfer the El Paso Section from Region 5 to Region 6.

With regard to your request that the results of Director Lillard's survey of the El Paso Section Members' interest in transferring to Region 6 (and also the rationale for not making the results public) be made available to the Region 6, Region 5 and El Paso Section Executive Committees, I plan to respect Director Lillard's decision and judgement to keep Region 5 business, and communications affecting the geographic units under her responsibility, within Region 5 boundaries.

I will, however, arrange for a formal survey to be made of all the voting members of the El Paso section. The survey and its analysis will be conducted by the Field Services Staff at Piscataway. I will make certain that the findings of the survey and my interpretation are made public to all parties concerned, when available. I also plan to ensure that the local Section will be encouraged to follow procedure and be the initiating entity for any action, not Region 6. I plan to report on my findings and recommendations to the 1989 President at a future IEEE Executive Committee meeting. If at that time your Regional Committee is still aggrieved, your 1989 Regional Director will have a chance to elucidate on the Regional concerns and if necessary appeal to overturn my recommendations to the President.

For the record, I would like you to note that Director Lillard has emphasized that at no time was there any intent to suppress the El Paso Section. At all times the Section Chairman, Mr. Al Pena, was kept informed of the survey, of the results and of the Region 5 EXCOM'S decision not to pursue the matter further.

Please also note that Mr. Coy has not yet communicated with me. He has chosen to ignore my advise for him to follow the Institute's due process.

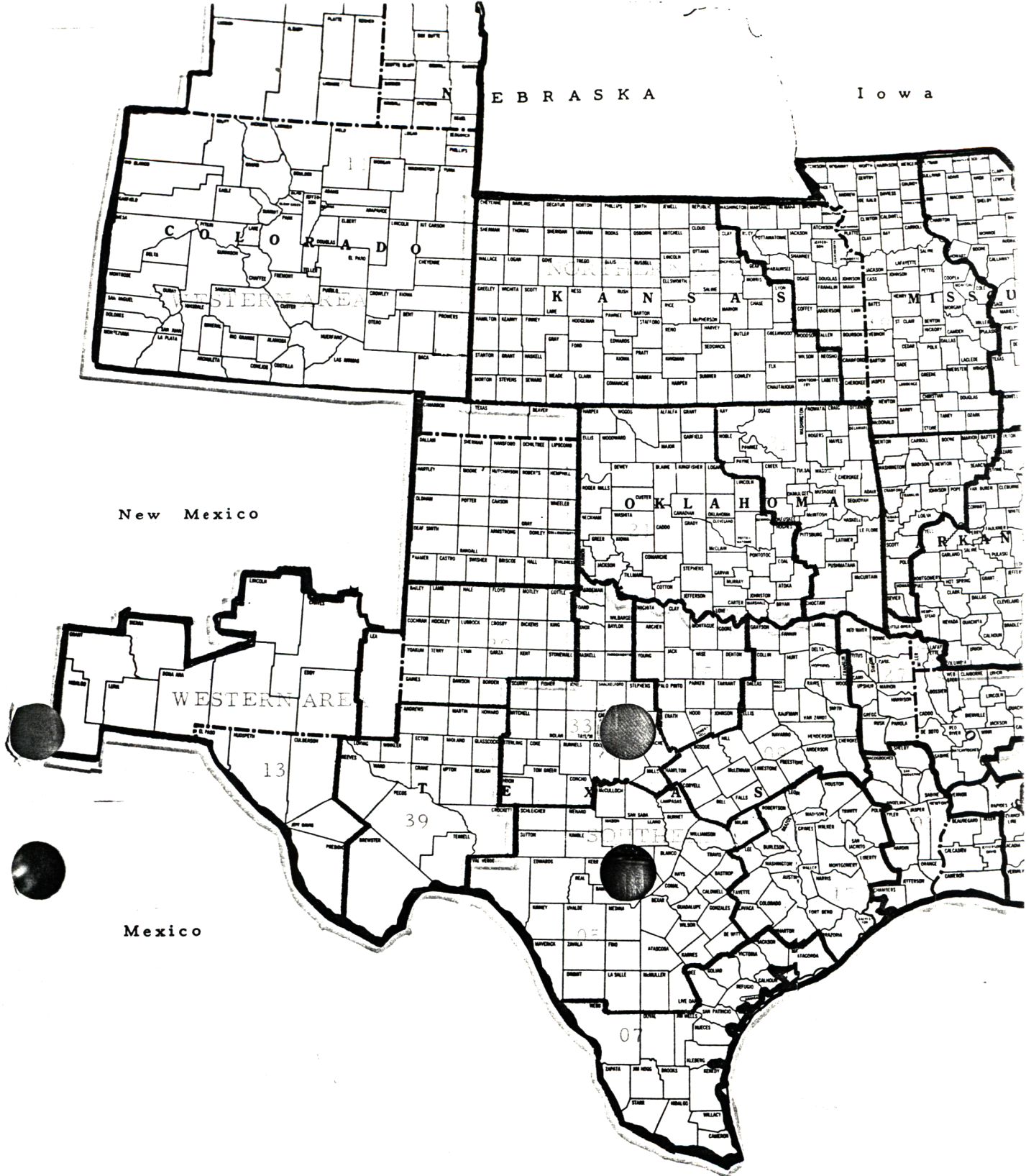
Rest assured that we will help the voting members of the El Paso Section to take whatever steps they believe are in the best interests of their geographic unit.

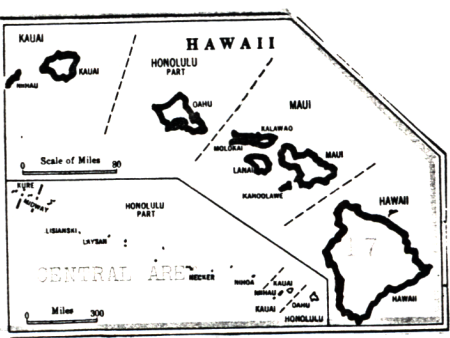
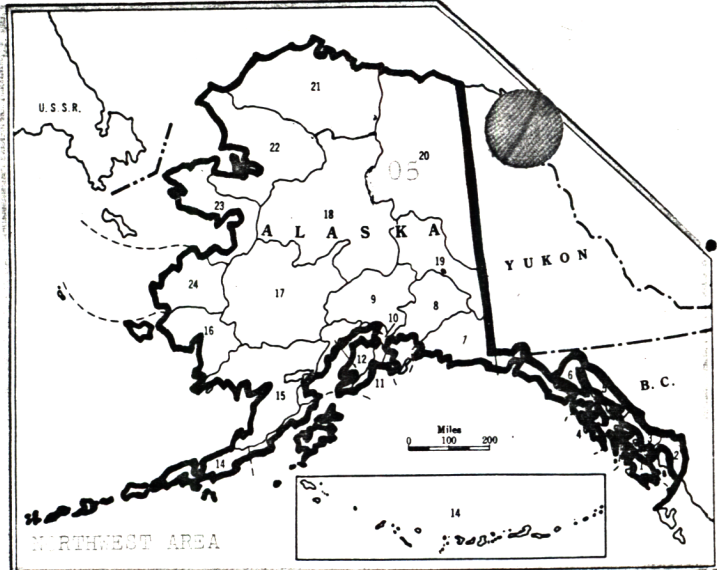

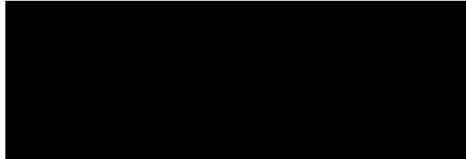

Please be advised that at my request, Field Services conducted a Section-wide, unbiased, cost effective survey of the Members of the El Paso Section to establish whether they were in favor of transferring to Region 6, or remaining in Region 5.

On January 24, 1989, a postage prepaid ballot was mailed to the 432 Members of the Section. They were requested to return the survey no later than March 3, 1989.

The following are the results of the survey:

- Remain part of Region 5, Southwestern USA: 66 Members
(Represents 53%)
- Be realigned into Region 6, Western USA: 55 Members
(Represents 44%)

Four ballots were returned without a preference noted.

This information was reported to President Pugh before the Executive Committee at its meeting of April 1, 1989. Based on the above results, it was concluded that the majority of members wish to remain part of Region 5 and that the case is closed.
