My dear Mr. Martin:-

Replying to your letter of the 2nd instant, the coming meeting of the Institute at Vancouver is to be held August 8-11, and it will be the annual "Pacific Coast Convention" of the Institute, it having been customary for several years past to hold such a convention under the auspices of one of the eight Sections of the Institute located in the Pacific Coast territory. I am unable to give you any more information than we have already published in the monthly Journal from time to time. The exact program has not yet been decided; but from previous experience in attending an Institute convention at Vancouver, I can assure you that if you have any intention of going you will not regret the trip.

Regarding the other matter mentioned in your letter, namely, the suggestion made at the dinner to the Past Presidents recently, I will say that there is no likelihood that a field editor will be added to the Institute staff in the near future. The different committees concerned have talked over many times the possibility of improving and developing our Journal still further, but in every instance it has always been decided that the wise thing for the Institute to do is to continue to limit its Journal practically to the papers and discussions presented at Institute meetings, and not to attempt to cover the field that has always been taken care of by commercial publications.

I am, however, very glad to have your suggestion regarding your son Kingsley; and in case anything should develop I shall be very glad to keep him in mind in connection with this matter, or with anything else that I think

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might be of interest to him.

the firm. This is entre nous.

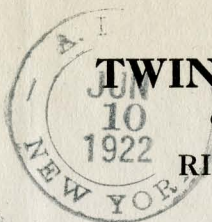
You see Sam at my
