On behalf of the Harvard School of Engineering and Applied Sciences (SEAS), we are very pleased to accept the IEEE's Milestone Award for Harvard's early electrical and physics research laboratories, best embodied in Cruft Laboratory.

Originally called the Cruft High Tension Laboratory, the structure was designed in 1915 to support research on antennas and storage batteries, and later, during WWII, was dedicated to work on radar.

Considered the location of the first government research grant given to an institution of higher learning, the building connects to Pierce Hall (home to engineering) through the aptly named van Vleck Bridge at the second and third levels. The bridge was commissioned by then dean of engineering John Hasbrouck van Vleck (who won a Nobel Prize for his work on magnetism). Cruft now connects to the new Laboratory for Integrated Science and Engineering (LISE) via a bridge at the third level, and it shares its west wall with Lyman Laboratory.

We intend to install the plaque proximate to the Pierce/Cruft bridge in Cruft itself (located at 19A Oxford Street) that celebrates the union of physics and engineering.
