- CONSTITUTION -
ROME SUBSECTION
SYRACUSE SECTION
THE INSTITUTE OF RADIO ENGINEERS

ARTICLE I

Name and Object

Sec. 1. This organization shall be known as the Rome Subsection of the Institute of Radio Engineers, Inc.

Sec. 2. The Subsection shall strive for the advancement of the theory and practice of radio engineering and of the allied arts and sciences, and the maintenance of high professional standing among its members, all in consonance with the Constitution and Bylaws of the Institute, and with special attention to such aims within the territory of the Section as are hereinafter defined.

Sec. 3. The Subsection shall aid in promoting close cooperation and good fellowship among its members and to this end shall hold meetings for the transaction of the regular business of the Subsection and for the presentation of papers and their discussion.

ARTICLE II

Membership

Sec. 1. All members of the Institute residing within the territory of the Subsection are automatically members of this Subsection. There shall be no other grades of membership.

Sec. 2. All Fellows, Senior Members, Members, and Associate Members of the Institute residing within the territory of the Subsection shall be entitled to attend the meetings, vote and hold office, except for the office of Subsection Chairman, which office must be filled by member grade or higher.

Sec. 3. Student Members of the Institute shall be entitled to attend meetings, but shall not have the right to vote or hold office.

ARTICLE III

Territory

Sec. 1. The territory of the Subsection shall initially include Oneida, in the State of New York, and may be enlarged or reduced in accordance with needs and requirements of the Syracuse Section and the Rome Subsection. ^{County}

ARTICLE IV

Dues

Sec. 1. There shall be no Subsection dues.

Sec. 2. The ordinary expenses of the Subsection shall be defrayed by the funds supplied by the Syracuse Section.

Sec. 3. Emergency or extraordinary expenses of the Subsection may be provided for by voluntary contribution from the membership of the Subsection. A unanimous vote of the Executive Committee is required before such a request may be made.

Sec. 4. The Subsection may require non-members who wish to be placed on the mailing list for notices, to pay in advance for the estimated cost of such notices.

Constitution, Home Subsection, IRE (Article V cont'd)

ARTICLE V

Officers

Sec. 1. The officers of the Subsection shall be a Chairman, a Vice-Chairman, and a Secretary-Treasurer.

Sec. 2. The terms of office for all officers shall begin at the close of the annual meeting, or as soon thereafter as the election result is determined, and shall end at the close of the next annual meeting, or as soon thereafter as the result of the election of new officers is determined, and in any case continue until their successors are duly elected and take office.

Sec. 3. The terms of office set forth above shall be approximately one year and may exceed this interval only in the case where the date of the annual meeting is being changed and a continuation in office is necessary to effect a new schedule, or no successor has been elected or appointed.

ARTICLE VI

Management

Sec. 1. There shall be an Executive Committee consisting of at least the officers, the Junior Past Chairman, and the Chairmen of all standing committees listed in Section 5 of Article VI. The Chairman may appoint, subject to confirmation by a majority vote of the above members of the Executive Committee, additional members to the Executive Committee from the Subsection membership.

Sec. 2. The chairman, responsible to the Executive Committee, shall have general supervision of the affairs of the Subsection. He shall preside at meetings of the Subsection and the Executive Committee, and have such other powers and perform such other duties as may be provided for in the Bylaws, or as may be delegated to him by vote of the Subsection. In his absence his duties shall be performed by the Vice-Chairman.

Sec. 3. The Secretary-Treasurer shall receive and deposit all monies in the name of the Subsection in such depository as shall be determined by the Executive Committee. He shall make only such disbursements as shall be ordered by the Executive Committee.

Sec. 4. The Secretary-Treasurer shall send out notices, prepare the agenda for, and record the minutes of all meetings of the Subsection and of the Executive Committee. He shall make such reports of his activities as may be required by the Executive Committee of the Section.

Sec. 5. The Chairman, as soon as expedient after the annual meeting, shall appoint the following standing committees: Meetings and Papers Committee; Membership Committee; Publicity Committee. Members appointed shall serve until their successors are appointed or committee dissolved. Other committees may be authorized by vote of the Subsection at any regular meeting, and shall be appointed by the Chairman of the Subsection.

ARTICLE VII

Nomination and Election of Officers

Sec. 1. All officers shall be elected at the annual meeting of the Subsection upon nomination by a nominating committee of three members not then officers of the Subsection, duly appointed by the Chairman of the Subsection two months before the annual meeting. These nominations shall be announced in the notice of the Annual Meeting.

Nominations may also be made from the floor.

Constitution, Rome Subsection, IRE (Article VII cont'd)

Sec. 2. When at an annual meeting there is more than one nominee for any one of the offices of Chairman, Vice-Chairman, or Secretary-Treasurer, the Chairman of the Subsection may conduct the election at the annual meeting if it is evident that a fair expression of the wishes of the membership can be then determined. As an alternative, he may announce that the results shall be determined by a letter ballot to be taken prior to the next regular meeting of the Subsection.

Sec. 3. In the event that election of officers is to be determined by letter ballot, the Secretary shall provide promptly to each voting member of the Subsection a letter ballot with return envelope as used by the Institute and with a return date specified, which shall in no case be later than six weeks after date of the annual meeting.

The Chairman shall call a meeting of the Executive Committee to constitute a tellers committee to count the vote and determine the successful candidate. The Chairman shall inform the successful candidates of their election and arrange for the transfer of responsibility to the new officers without delay.

Sec. 4. Vacancies in office occurring during the year shall be filled by the Executive Committee for the remainder of the unexpired term unless otherwise provided for.

Sec. 5. If for any reason the best interests of the Subsection seem to require a change in the governing body during the year, the matter shall be duly and carefully considered by the Executive Committee. Upon not less than two-thirds vote of the Executive Committee, or upon receipt by the Executive Committee of a petition signed by ten (10) members of the Subsection, recommendation shall be made to the Subsection for action at a special meeting to be duly called by the Executive Committee for the sole purpose of considering and voting upon such a change. A two-thirds vote of the members present shall be necessary to declare an office vacant. Upon two thirds vote of the members present the vacant office may be filled for the unexpired term upon nomination from the floor.

ARTICLE VIII

Meetings

Sec. 1. The Subsection shall not hold less than four regular meetings during the year, one of which shall be an annual meeting.

Sec. 2. These meetings shall be held at some specific time in the year as prescribed in the Subsection Bylaws.

Sec. 3. The fiscal year of the Subsection shall correspond with the fiscal year of the Institute. (Calendar Year).

Sec. 4. At least ten members shall be present to constitute a quorum at all meetings of the Subsection called for the transaction of regular business and requiring a vote to be taken, but a higher number may be set to constitute a quorum, such number to be determined by a Bylaw voted upon by the Subsection membership.

Sec. 5. A majority vote of the members present is necessary for the election of officers.

Sec. 6. Meetings of the Executive Committee shall be held at such time as shall be found necessary. Executive Committee meetings may be called by the Chairman of the Subsection at his own discretion or shall be at the request of three members of the committee.

Constitution, Rome Subsection, IRE (Article VIII cont'd).

Sec. 7. A majority of the members of the Executive Committee shall constitute a quorum at all meetings of the Executive Committee, except as otherwise, provided herein.

Sec. 8. A majority vote of the Executive Committee shall be necessary in the conduct of its business except as otherwise provided in this constitution or in the Subsection Bylaws.

Sec. 9. The Secretary-Treasurer shall send out notices of all regular Subsection meetings to all Institute members in the territory of the Subsection at least one week prior to the date of the meeting. These notices shall contain a full statement of the time, place, and business of the meeting.

ARTICLE IX

Amendments

Sec. 1. This constitution may be amended by a two-thirds vote of all voting members present at any meeting of the Subsection, provided that notice of the proposed meeting and the proposal change are sent to members of the Subsection at least one month in advance of the meeting. Such action shall be subject to the approval of the Syracuse Section Executive Committee.

Sec. 2. Suitable Bylaws of this Constitution may be adopted by a two-thirds vote of the voting members present at any regular meeting, providing that notice of the proposed change has been sent to each voting member at least one week prior to such meeting. Such Bylaws must be consonant with the Constitution and Bylaws of the Institute and this Constitution. A copy of these Bylaws shall be filed with the Secretary-Treasurer of the Syracuse Section.

Subject: I.R.E. Subsection

Dear Mr. Cole:

I was very interested in learning last Thursday of your thoughts regarding the establishment of an I.R.E. Subsection at Rome. I gather that you have at least some 40 members transferring up from New Jersey, and you should be able to establish a Subsection without too much difficulty. This letter will advise of some of the requirements for establishing a Subsection; we encourage you to go ahead with it.

The Board of Directors has recently approved an amendment to the Constitution for Sections under Article IX, Section 3.2. For your information, I am attaching two copies of this amendment.

Part of the requirement will be that the geographical area delegated to the Subsection be defined, and I would suggest that you consult a map and make your proposal on this. For your information, the Syracuse Section embraces the following counties in New York:

Broome	Lewis
Cayuga	Madison
Chenango	Oneida
Cortland	Onondaga
Delaware	Oswego
Franklin	St. Lawrence
Herkimer	Tioga
Jefferson	Tompkins

The Binghamton Subsection now has allotted to it, according to my records, Broome, Tioga and Chenango counties.

You also will be interested to see a copy of the Constitution of the Binghamton Subsection, which you will find enclosed.

In accordance with Article IX of the Sections Constitution, we assume you will proceed with the preparation of a petition for the formation of a

Subsection. For your information in this connection, we are attaching a copy of the Petition submitted by Binghamton in 1949.

I think it will be fine if we can get the Rome Subsection established this Spring so that you can be under a full head of steam next Fall. I urge therefore that you try to have a Petition submitted in time for our next Executive Committee Meeting which is scheduled for April 25. The Annual Meeting for our Section is May 17, and there will be one Executive Committee Meeting after that date and before next Fall, although a special meeting can be called, if necessary.

I am sure some more questions will arise, and we may have to get together to resolve them, but trust this letter answers most of them, and that you can get underway without delay. Let us know how we can help further.

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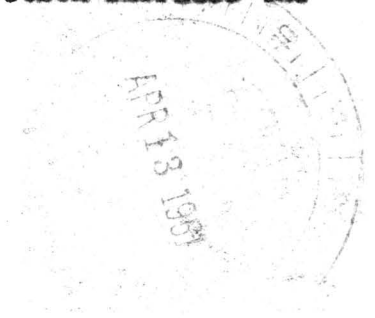
