Dear Miss Hazard:

We are preparing for inclusion in the May 1934 issue of our publication, ELECTRICAL ENGINEERING, considerable information on the founding of the Institute fifty years ago. In this connection we have prepared biographical sketches on all individuals prominent in the Institute at that time, with one exception, namely, Rowland R. Hazard. For Mr. Hazard, we have no information available, other than that he was the Institute's first treasurer, and was in 1884 president of the Gramme Electric Company, New York City.

I have just noticed that you are listed in Who's Who in America for 1932-33 as a daughter of Rowland Hazard. Provided that you are a daughter of the Mr. Hazard in whom we are interested, and are able to supply us with a brief sketch of him, we would appreciate it greatly, and would be very much indebted to you. 
