Dear Mr. Ferguson:

I take pleasure in notifying you of your enrolment upon the Institute records as a Member for Life, as provided in the constitution and by-laws of the Institute. The following is an extract from the by-laws adopted in December 1928:

"Section 20. On May first of each year the National Secretary shall notify each member who has paid dues for thirty-five (35) years or who shall have reached the age of seventy (70) after having paid dues for thirty (30) years, that he is eligible for exemption from future annual dues and that his name has been enrolled upon the records as a 'Member for Life'. This notice shall accompany the usual bill of membership dues rendered at the beginning of the fiscal year, and such bills shall continue to be issued until the member concerned has indicated his acceptance of exemption from the future payment of dues."

The above ruling is brought to your attention at this time in order that you may, if desired, apply for exemption from the payment of membership dues for the period beginning May 1, 1937.
