EXTRACT FROM THE CONSTITUTION.

SPECIAL SECTION. Any person who shall be a Member at the time this group of amendments is adopted, (May 21, 1912) shall, on written request to the Secretary prior to May 1, 1913, without the payment of the transfer fee, or increase of life membership fee, have the right to become a Fellow, provided he refers to at least five Fellows or Members who, upon inquiry, shall certify that he meets the requirements of the grade of Fellow, as herein defined.

- 4. A Fellow shall not be less than thirty-two years of age and shall be either:
 - a. An electrical engineer by profession. As such he shall be qualified to design and to take responsible charge of important electrical work; he shall have been in the active practice of his profession for at least ten years, and shall have had responsible charge of important electrical work for at least three years.

When the applicant holds in a principal national society of an allied branch of engineering, membership of a grade for which the qualifications indicate a standing equal to that required for the grade of Fellow herein, such membership shall be considered equivalent to five of the requisite ten years of active practice of the electrical profession.

- b. A professor of electrical engineering or of electrical science. As such he shall have attained special distinction as an expounder of the principles of electrical science and of electrical engineering; he shall have had at least ten year's experience as a teacher of electrical subjects, and shall have had responsible charge for three years, in an electrical course of a principal school of engineering. Any years of experience as defined in paragraph "a" that the applicant may have had as an electrical engineer shall be considered the equivalent of the same number of years of experience as a "teacher of electrical subjects."
- c. A person who has done notable original work in electrical science of a character to give him a recognized standing equivalent to that required for Fellows under paragraphs "a" and "b."
- d. A person regularly engaged in electrical work for at least ten years, who, by inventions or by special proficiency in contributions to electrical science or the electrical arts or electrical literature, has attained a standing equivalent to that required for Fellows under paragraphs "a" and "b."

EXTRACTS FROM THE BY-LAWS.

Special Section. Any person who was a Member or Associate in good standing on May 21, 1912, may apply for transfer to the grade of Fellow or Member respectively (in accordance with the special section of Article II of the Constitution, adopted May 21, 1912) under the following conditions:

- a. Applications shall be made on forms prescribed by the Board of Directors; these forms will be supplied by mail or otherwise upon application to Institute headquarters.
 - b. Applications must be submitted to the Secretary prior to May 1, 1913.
- c. Applications shall embody a statement of the age, period of practice, and present occupation of the applicant and shall state under which one of more of clauses "a, b, c, d," of Sections 4 or 5, Article II, of the Constitution the application is made.
- d. Applicants shall refer to the number of references specified in the special section, Article II of the Constitution, each of whom shall be invited by the Secretary to certify upon a prescribed form that the applicant meets the requirements of the grade desired, as defined in Article II of the Constitution, which requirements shall be printed on the form. Upon the receipt of the required number of certifications in proper form, the Board of Examiners shall approve the application for publication of the names of the applicant and his certifiers in the PROCEEDINGS; and, not less than twenty days after publication, the Board of Directors shall act upon the application.
- e. Should an applicant for transfer to the grade of Member or Fellow certify that he is not personally known to the required number of members of the respective grades as specified in the Special Section of Article II of the Constitution, the Board of Examiners may accept for the deficiency other references, preferably professional engineers who are members of leading American or foreign engineering societies.
- f. The names of all applicants transferred by the Board of Directors in accordance with this special section shall be published in the PROCEEDINGS.
