Dear Mr. Henline:

It is rather likely that I shall sail for Europe a week from next Saturday, and, therefore, it is a particularly opportune time to take up a matter which I have meant to take up with you for some time.

You will recall that I lost the President pin during my term of office, and that it was replaced rather against my protest, without expense to me.

At the Convention in Milwaukee I lost the President pin for the second time. It was lost somewhere in the room at which we had the luncheon meeting of the Directors, and both the hotel and I conducted a very exhaustive search without finding it.

Since my term of office was nearly expired, I did not see that there would be any particular reason for replacing it at that time, but now that I am going to Europe, I would highly value the opportunity of wearing a President's pin of the American Institute of Electrical Engineers, and am very desirous of replacing it.

This time I must insist that it be replaced at my expense and not at the expense of the Institute, but realize that I can only get the pin through the Institute's authorization.

Would you kindly take such steps as are necessary? It is rather likely that I will be in New York next Friday, September 23rd, at the meeting of the John Fritz Medal Board. Possibly you could arrange to have it by that time, but if not, I will again be in New York the following Saturday morning, October 1st, as I will sail that afternoon.
