It has been suggested that because of the interest of Dr. Scott in ECPD that we should be active in planning out a useful means of giving adequate recognition to him.

Also, there was recognition of Dr. Scott in the last meeting of the United Engineering Trustees, Inc., and Mr. Farmer was to speak with you concerning the thought of the American Institute of Electrical Engineers.

Since Dr. Scott was primarily electrical, it may be that the AIEE will want to have a leading part in the recognition. Since Dr. Scott's interest included the other branches of engineering, the other engineering groups undoubtedly will be thinking in terms of honoring him. 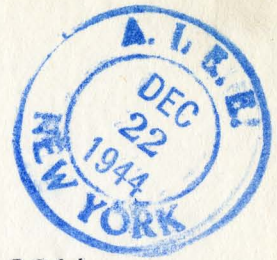
