Dear Mr. Hooven:

Since our meeting, I have made one interesting discovery namely that we publish more editorial pages a year than the IRE if all pages of the preprint system are taken into consideration. AIRE total editorial pages 16,587; IRE total editorial pages 15,338.

Attached is the paragraph pertaining to publications to appear in President Chase's message to the membership in our December issue. This has been checked by telephone with Woody Gannett, who informed me that in all their tallies they include covers; hence I have added covers to our figures so that they would be on a comparable basis. Although their figures include the Directory Listings, 645 pages, and the Student Quarterly, 224 pages, we have not included the AIEE Membership Directory because it was not issued until October 1961 and the EE Digest, which is 40 pages of king size.

For working convenience, attached is a tabulation of the pages of published material for both institutes.

During our last meeting, you asked why the Transactions did not pay out better and I don't recall whether I gave you the explanation. If you are looking at the accounting figures at the close of the last fiscal year, there was a total expense of \$66,141, which included approximately \$17,850 for a 10-year Cumulative Index. This was not issued until toward the close of the year and most of the income will be derived during the current year with some sale four or five years hence. Last July, we issued a circular to the entire membership and nonmember subscribers soliciting subscriptions to all of the publications. This was done at an expenditure of approximately \$4500 and to date, it has brought in over \$13,000 worth of subscriptions. Volume 77 of the 1958 Transactions is now completely sold out. Also, higher income is reflected in the accounting figures for the first 3 months of this year compared with the first 3 months of the previous year for subscriptions to EE, Transactions, and the bimonthlies.
