PRINCIPLES OF CONSOLIDATION MICHIGAN SECTION, AIEE AND DETROIT SECTION, IRE

This organization shall be known as the Southeastern Michigan Section of the Institute of Electrical and Electronic Engineers.

Its objectives shall be the advancement of the theory and practice of Electrical and Electronic Engineering and of the allied Arts and Sciences, and the maintenance of a high professional standing among its members. The Section shall foster engineering education and its coordination with engineering practice. It shall also broaden the usefulness of the engineering profession in civic matters.

The territory of the Southeastern Michigan Section shall consist of the counties of Jackson, Washtenaw, Wayne, Ingham, Livingston, Oakland, Eaton, Clinton, Macomb, and St. Clair in Michigan, and the county of Essex in Ontario, Canada.

All Honorary Members, Fellows, Senior Members, Members, Life Members and Associates of the I.E.E.E. residing within the territory of the Section, are members of the Section. Student Members of the Institute shall be entitled to attend all meetings of the Section but they shall not have the right to vote or hold office. Dues paid by Institute members for their Institute membership shall be the only dues required for membership in the Section.

The Officers of the Section shall be a chairman, Vice-Chairman, Secretary and Treasurer. There shall also be eight Directors. The Officers and Directors shall be elected for a term of one year and shall assume the duties of their position beginning June 1, 1963. Candidates for Officers and Directors shall be members of the Section.

The Chairman shall have general supervision of the affairs of the Section, with the approval of the Board of Directors.

The Vice-Chairman shall perform the duties of the Chairman in the Chairman's absence.

The Secretary shall perform the usual duties which are normally delegated to the Secretary of an organization.

The Treasurer shall be responsible for all Section financial operations.

The Board of Directors shall be the governing body of the Section and shall direct the management of Section affairs. The Board of Directors shall consist of the Chairman, Vice-Chairman, Secretary, Treasurer, the Junior Past Chairman, the eight elected Directors, and not more than two other Directors appointed by the Chairman at his discretion.

Each Director shall have administrative supervision over a division of the Section activities as designated by the Chairman. Under the general direction of the Chairman, he shall have responsibility for the proper functioning and coordination of the committee organizations that comprise the division over which he has supervision. The eight divisions shall include:

<u>Section Meetings</u> - to include committees to plan and execute regular Section meetings in Detroit, Ann Arbor, and Jackson-Lansing areas.

Technical Meetings - to include committees to plan and execute meetings on specialized technical subjects not covered by the Professional-Technical groups. <u>Professional-Technical Groups</u> - to establish liasion with the Professional-Technical groups organized in the Section Area.

<u>Professional Activities</u> - to include committees to plan and execute educational programs directed to the professional development of the members.

Student Activities - to include committees to advise and encourage Student Branches and to provide student guidance.

Affiliate Activities - to include committees and representatives who engage in inter-society activities.

<u>Section Development</u> - to include committees to encourage membership, promote public relations and develop the professional status of the Section.

Section Operations - to include those committees which aid and support the administrative and operational functions of the organization, including all publications, special technical conferences, historian, etc.

The Standing Committees shall be appointed by the Chairman with the concurrence of the Board for a term of one year beginning June 1, 1963.

An Advisory Committee of the Section shall be formed and shall consist of the Board of Directors and the Chairmen and Vice-Chairmen of all Standing Committees. The Advisory Committee shall act as an advisory committee to the Board of Directors, and shall meet at least once a year.

Officers and Directors shall be elected by letter ballot. A Nominating Committee of six members shall be appointed, three members each by the governing bodies of the local AIEE and IRE Sections. The Nominating Committee shall nominate one candidate for Chairman, two candidates each for Vice-Chairman, Secretary and Treasurer, and ten candidates for Director. The nomination of candidates shall be reported to the members through the respective February issues of Section publications and at the February Section Meetings. Additional nominations for any office may be made by a petition signed by at least 50 members qualified to vote, submitted to the Chairman of the Nominating Committee by March 8, 1963.

The Nominating Committee shall mail an official ballot to all members of each Section by March 15, 1963. Persons holding membership in both IRE and AIEE shall be entitled to vote each ballot.

The Nominating Committee shall report the results of the election to the governing bodies of the respective Sections before the regular Joint April Section meeting. The candidate receiving the highest number of votes for each of the offices of Chairman, Vice-Chairman, Secretary, and Treasurer shall be declared elected to these offices. The eight candidates receiving the highest number of votes for the office of Director shall be declared elected as Directors. The results of the election shall be announced to the membership at the April meeting.

As soon as practicable the Board of Directors of the Southeastern Section IEEE shall implement preparation of By-Laws for the Section.

Any section of these Principles of Consolidation found to be in violation of the National Constitution and By-Laws of the IEEE shall be automatically void.

Dear Mr. Relyea:

This letter will confirm our conversation of several days ago concerning the comments you submitted to IRE headquarters on the manner in which new officers for the local PGEC chapter were recently appointed.

As I offered at that time, I have again scanned the documents which govern national and chapter operations of the PGEC. In these, rules of procedure are spelled out in detail for the national organization and are suggested for local chapters. Concerning the latter, although it is not mandatory for the chapters to hold annual election of their officers in any particular way, it is clearly the intent of the suggested rules that formal elections be held. Of course, implicit in this recommendation is the understanding that qualified candidates are nominated and willing to run for the various offices.

As stated in my Newsletter as retiring chairman, the reason for not holding elections this year as we have done in the past several years was simply that it did not prove possible to obtain more than one candidate for each of the three offices. Our experience of the past few years in like situations was that the slate presented by the Nominations Committee was invariably elected by the overwhelming vote of our membership, and I expected that the same thing would happen this year. As a result, it was my recommendation that next year's officers be appointed, and that the postcards which had been obtained for ballot purposes be more productively used in obtaining background information and program suggestions from our members.

It is interesting to note that you were the only person among approximately sixty who returned cards who took exception to the procedure which we followed. This does not prove that we were fundamentally right, but does illustrate that our action had the tacit support of the large majority of our chapter members. Despite this I agree with you that the proper way to handle the selection of chapter officers is by formal election. It was my recommendation to the appointed officers for 1961-62 that more and earlier thought be given next spring to obtaining a suitable group of nominees for office, and your letter will, I am sure, strengthen their determination to do so. As Past Chairman I will be able to contribute to this effort.

As we discussed previously, in an association such as ours successful accomplishment of group objectives depends not merely on the effort applied by the officers. Much more important is the active participation of the membership. This effort is spearheaded by members like yourself who are sufficiently interested in the organization to take constructive steps when they feel that its activities are being handled in anything less than the best fashion. Our program for 1961-62 is intended to provide more opportunity than before for members other than officers to engage actively in promoting and leading chapter activities. I have indicated to the new officers your willingness to take part in this effort, and expect that they will be in touch with you soon to discuss how best this can be done.

- 1. November 1, 1960, at ESD, Detroit: "The Application of Tunnel Diodes to Digital Computers," by F. K. Buelow, IBM Product Development Laboratories, Poughkeepsie, N. Y.
- 2. November 28, 1960, at Willow Run Research Laboratories: "Modeling Techniques for Digital Computers," by Richard R. Legault, Institute of Science and Technology, University of Michigan.

- 3. January 30, 1961, at Lafayette Clinic, Detroit: "The Use of Automatic Data Reduction Techniques in the Study of Physiological Aspects of Emotion," by Dr. A. F. Ax and G. Zacharopoulos, of the Lafayette Clinic.
- 4. May 1, 1961, at the Cooley Building, University of Michigan, Ann Arbor: "Adaptive Mechanisms and Simple Learning Machines," by Prof. F. H. Westervelt, University of Michigan.

Attendance at these meetings was 22, 35, 27, and 23 respectively, of whom about half were PGEC members.

During the past year, both the Association for Computing Machinery and the American Institute of Electrical Engineers substantially increased their computer-oriented activity in this area. Local members of the ACM formed a Metropolitan Detroit Chaper and held meetings during last winter and spring. The AIEE Michigan Section established an Electronic Computer Committee late in the spring. Both of these moves were encouraged by the PGEC Executive Committee as constructive steps towards enhancing Detroit's position and image as a major center of computer activity.

A direct consequence of these developments has been the decision to hold the 1963 Spring Joint Computer Conference in Detroit. The choice was made by the Executive Committee of the newly formed American Federation of Information Processing Societies, successor to the National Joint Computer Committee. The decision resulted from representations made to the committee by the Detroit ACM, AIEE, and IRE organizations, all of which had to have formal local chapters to qualify Detroit as a potential site for a Joint Computer Conference.

PLANS FOR 1961-1962

After extended canvassing of PGEC members, the Nominating Committee, of which Allan H. Albert is Chairman, submitted the names of the following candidates for elective offices of the chapter:

Chairman: G. Zacharopoulos

Vice-Chairman: Y. Morita

Secretary: W. E. Chapelle

It had been Mr. Albert's intention to distribute a ballot similar to that employed for the last two years, providing space for write-in candidates as an alternative to the official candidates. However, our recent experience has shown that practically all votes are cast for the slate of officers proposed by the Nominating Committee. As a result, the candidates listed above have been appointed for the 1961-1962 season, and have already assumed the responsibilities of office. Our ballot postcards will be used in a different way, as described in a later paragraph.

A brief biographical sketch of each member of the 1961-1962 Executive Committee is given below:

- BEE, University of Detroit and MSEE, University of Michigan. Formerly with the Willow Run Laboratory, he is now at Bendix Research Laboratories as a Project Engineer in the Computer Department. His work includes circuit development for analog and hybrid analog-digital systems, and the system engineering of such equipment.

1961-1962 Meetings

Plans for next year are being prepared by the newly appointed committee. A significant new feature will be the close cooperation between the PGEC and the AIEE Electronic Computer Committee. We plan to hold joint meetings in some cases, and will cooperate in publicizing our separate meetings. Arrangements with the ACM are less formal at present, but we expect to work closely with them as well as with the AIEE in developing a program suited to the wide range of interests among computer people in the area.

Formation of Technical Panels

As published last fall, the scope of the IRE Professional Group on Electronic Computers and its publications encompasses:

- (a) all aspects of design, theory, and practice relating to systems for digital and analog computation and information processing;
- (b) components and circuits for digital and analog systems, including techniques for accomplishing the functions of arithmetic, memory, control, mass data storage, input, output, and external communication in such systems;
- (c) relevant portions of supporting disciplines, including switching theory, symbolic logic, numerical methods, codes and number representation systems, abstract machine or automaton theory, machine learning, pattern recognition, and other extensions of logical machine capabilities;
- (d) testing, operation, and reliability of digital and analog systems; and
- (e) those aspects of application, use and programming of digital and analog computing devices and information processing systems that relate to their design and operation.

Practically all of these disciplines are included in the activities of our chapter members. To increase the effectiveness of the chapter in meeting the needs of its members, it has been decided to set up a number of Technical Panels. These informal groups will provide a focal point

for the exchange of ideas among specialists in several major areas. They will also advise the Executive Committee concerning meeting content, etc.

Several chapter members have already indicated their interest in participating in panel activities. The enclosed postcard will enable all members to identify their areas of professional interest and will be the basis for further detailing the panel plan.
