Our plans have been reviewed from time to time with our Regional Director and he has discussed them informally with the Section's Committee and others to help insure that we were planning wisely.

TO: All Members Executive Committee

The Charlotte Subsection undertook a detailed investigation to determine the relative merits for changing to Section status. Attached is a copy of their committee report which was reviewed by their executive committee and has led to their decision to work toward full Section status.

Before any open action was taken, their chairman and representative called on me to discuss their proposal. appreciate this and their expression that this was a positive step for growth and not a result of dissatisfaction with our N. C. Section or any of its officers.

I felt it advisable to check with headquarters concerning the proposed change. Our regional director, Dr. Weil, was on a trip so I discussed the matter first with Donald Fink, General Manager and then with W. E. Peterson, Vice President and Chairman of the Sections Committee. Later I reached Dr. Weil. All of these gentlemen recommended section status for any group meeting the requirements. All Subsections in the N. C. Section do meet these requirements.

The chief disadvantage recognized by most of our members in going to individual sections is the loss of statewide bonds and the ability to sponsor symposia, publications and other statewide activities.

I have proposed therefore that we consider organizing a North Carolina District to retain these bonds and activities. I questioned the practicality of this with Messers. Weil, Peterson and Fink. It was reviewed by them last week at the meeting in Chicago. Their recommondation is that we proceed with this plan.

This is more than a name change - it can and should reflect definite growth. Each new Section would gain all the advantages outlined in the Charlotte study and the disadvantages would be offset by the formation of a District.

The District organization would eliminate many of the recognized problems we now have. As a District we would not be required to have a set number of meetings but could better adjust to a smaller number of well planned and supported meetings.

The District officers would not have as many administrative duties so would have more time to offer for Statewide activities.

The smaller sections would offer more opportunity to develop officers and leaders and insure better recognition of capable men.

The District would not receive any direct financing from Headquarters. I do not feel that a North Carolina District, IEEE, would have trouble financially. We do not aim to make money. We have proved we can and will back statewide meetings such as our Symposium and our excellent Bulletin and can continue to make these self supporting.

As I see it, we have at least three choices.

- (1) Retain our present organization, disapproving any Subsections' petition to withdraw and form separate sections.
- (2) Retain the North Carolina Section with whatever Subsection or Subsections wish to remain and approving the withdrawal of any Subsection or Subsections which wish to reorganize as sections.
- (3) Reorganize, as outlined above, with a District and as many individual Sections as necessary to best divide our area.

Will each of you as members of our governing Executive Committee consider this, review the IEEE Bylaws in the Sections Manual, and be prepared to discuss this proposal at our next meeting scheduled for 10 a.m., November 21, 1964. This is a big step, we must face it squarely and plan wisely to insure that we do move ahead.

I have received your letter of August 2, and I am glad that you feel that the committee's recommendation of additional counties will be acceptable. Enclosed is a copy of the subsections by counties which will be proposed at a later date. Dr. Hoadley is drawing up a final plan for the operation of the subsections. I am enclosing this copy to give you an idea of what the final copy will be like when he submits it for publication. The proposed plan for subsection operation will include three subsections in Virginia as well. You should note here that the plan merely establishes boundaries for subsections which we hope will be adhered to in the formation of new subsections.

As far as the operation of the subsections is concerned, the proposed plan for subsection operation will read something as follows:

- 1. Subsections shall be established only by the action of the executive committee of the section upon receipt of a petition from a local group in accordance with the procedure set forth in the section manual.
- 2. Subsection territories shall conform to the boundaries set by the section Executive Committee.
 - (a) The territory of the section shall be divided into potential subsection areas. The total of these subsection areas shall be the whole area of the section, so that no area is excluded from the subsection plan. (The proposed boundaries are shown in the attached map.)

(b) Groups of members near a subsection boundary may petition the Executive Committee for a change of the boundary to meet their convenience.

- 3. Subsection meetings shall be the responsibility of the subsection officers.
- 4. The section shall hold at least one meeting per year in the territory of each subsection. These section meetings shall be the responsibility of the Section Executive Committee.
- 5. The section shall contribute 50 cents per subsection member to each subsection to help defray the cost of subsection operation. In addition, the subsection shall receive any other funds which national headquarters may assign to the section for subsection use. (Currently, this is \$10 per meeting up to five meetings per subsection per year.)
- 6. Notice of subsection meetings shall be mailed to all members of the IRE residing in the subsection area. Other members of the section may receive these notices upon their request and upon payment of 50 cents per year to the subsection to defray the cost of mailing the notices, but this provision shall be void if it violates the policy of the IRE headquarters.
- 7. A financial report shall be made by each subsection to the section treasurer as soon after December 31st as possible. This shall be similar in nature to the report which the section treasurer must make to national head-quarters. It shall not contain the details of the cost of dinner meetings, but shall list only the net gain or loss on each dinner meeting.

The proposed plan must be submitted to the Section in the form of a proposed change of by-laws. However, if the Piedmont Sub-Section is willing to include the extra counties suggested by the Executive Committee, there should be no hindrance to the formation and acceptance of that sub-section.

As you remember a committee was formed in Richmond on April 13th to lay the groundwork for the formation of an I.R.E. Section to include the members in North Carolina and Virginia except those living within fifty miles of Washington, D. C. Members of this committee are R. N. Eubank of Richmond, Virginia, Chairman, W. S. Carley of Raleigh, North Carolina and W. M. Breazeale.

The committee has now secured 52 signatures of Associates, Members and Senior Members believed to be in good standing to a petition asking the Board of Directors to grant us a section. We shall greatly appreciate your bringing this petition to the attention of the Board and hope that we shall learn of early and favorable action on their part.

This is partly in answer to your letter of March 13 and partly an interim report on the progress towards forming a North Carolina - Virginia Section of the IRE.

A meeting was held last Saturday in Richmond in conjunction with the ARRL Meeting and a start was made toward forming the section. Mr. George K. Bailey was present and addressed the group. The enclosed rexograph sheet describes the results of the meeting and indicates what we will try to do next.

I hope that we will have some 40 or 50 signatures to the petition within a few weeks so that we can request the IRE Board of Directors to grant us a section.

The movement, so far, has attracted considerable interest among radio and electronic people here and in North Carolina. The rate atwhich they apply for membership in the Institute seems to be limited, in part at least, by the rate at which we can obtain application blanks:

I was interested to learn that a special committee has been apointed to settle the question of how to handle the New York Meeting. I suspect that one reason so many people tried to crowd into the technical sessions, which were not supposed to draw the crowds, is because there are so many physicists and allied scientists who are now members of the IRE. These people are not as interested in systems, radio circuits and operation as they are in fundamental scientific developments. Most of the applications which I have signed in the past few months were from people who are distinctly not operating radio engineers.

If our section is successfully established, I hope you can visit us while you are President of the Institute.

Dear Fellow Member of the IRE:

Thank you for returning the IRE Section questionnaire. To date we have received nearly fifty favorable replies. On the basis of these replies plus the results of a meeting described below it was decided to go ahead with efforts to form a North Carolina - Virginia section of the IRE.

The ARRL gathering in Richmond on April 13 brought together a number of IRE members. After the ARRL technical session, Mr. R. N. Eubank of Richmond called a meeting of IRE members and other interested people to discuss the formation of an IRE section. Mr. George K. Bailey, Executive Secretary of the IRE, addressed the gathering and then several people spoke from the floor. Mr. Bailey assured the group that the Institute Board of Directors would be glad to see a section formed and the sentiment of the others who spoke was favorable toward such a procedure. It was also agreed that meetings should be held in the various parts of the territory covered by the section.

The question was raised as to whether or not the proposed section should include both States. The concensus of the people from North Carolina who spoke was that they would like the section to include both States until the time comes when there are enough IRE members to form a strong North Carolina section.

The Chairman announced that a petition had been prepared and requested all IRE members present who wished to support the proposed section to sign. Mr. L. R. Quarles moved that a small committee be appointed to secure more signatures to the petition if same were needed, to forward the petition to the Board of Directors and, if the petition is approved, to lay plans for an organizational meeting. A committee consisting of R. N. Eubank, Chairman, W. S. Carley of North Carolina State College in Raleigh, and W. M. Breazeale was appointed.

Eighteen signatures were obtained on the petition after the meeting. Although only twenty-five are required the sponsers would like to have nearly double this many before sending the petition to the Institute Board of Directors. Hence, it will be greatly appreciated if you will sign the copy of the petition which is attached and return it in the enclosed envelope.

Dear Mr. Eubank:

In reply to your letter received today, with reference to the possible formation of a Virginia Section of the Institute, we submit the following information:

The first step in the formation of a Section is the determination of the boundary of the Section, which is always expressed in terms of counties.

The second step should be a discussion with the officers of the Section which now contains the counties which you wish to transfer to the Virginia Section. In this case, it would be the Washington Section officers.

If the Washington Section officers agree to your proposal, you have no further difficulty with reference to territory. If they do not agree with your proposal, the dispute would have to go to the Board of Directors of the Institute. They would probably order a poll of the members of the Institute in the disputed territory as to the preference of those members for remaining in the Washington Section or forming a new Virginia Section. A majority of votes would settle the question.

The third step to be taken after the question of boundary has been decided is to write out a petition stating the boundaries for the Section. This petition must be signed by notfewer than 25 members as specified in Section 38 of the Constitution.

Your petition is then presented to the next meeting of the Executive Committee which would probably recommend the formation of a new Section to the Board of Directors, who would act upon it at their meeting the next day.

The fourth step would be the careful consideration of the Section Manual and the election of officers in accordance with the Manual. You might note at this time that the Chairman of the new Section must be of Member grade or higher. An Associate is not eligible to be Chairman.

When the new Section has been authorized by the Board of Directors and your officers elected in accordance with the Section Constitution, you are then eligible for a rebate to the Section of \$0.75 per member per year for every member up to 700 and \$0.90 per year for all members over 700. In addition, the Section is entitled to a rebate of \$10.00 per meeting per year up to a maximum of ten meetings per year.

In accordance with your request, we are forwarding under separate cover 50 application blanks.


