SUBJECT: Proposed Revisions to IEEE Bylaw 401.2 - Regions

BACKGROUND: During its May 31, 1985 meeting, the Regional Activities Board approved a recommendation to the Board of Directors that proposed revisions to IEEE Bylaw 401.2 (Attached), transferring the Jamaica Section from Region 9 to Region 3, be adopted.

At its June 2-3, 1985 meeting, the Board of Directors reviewed this proposal and approved a Motion that action be postponed until a petition for this transfer is received which will indicate the wishes of the Jamaica members involved.

In the latter part of June, a mail petition was sent to 70 higher grade Jamaican members asking for a response on whether or not they agree with the transfer of the Jamaica Section from Region 9 to Region 3. Responses have not been received from this mailing due in part to (1) a postal strike and (2) a fire that destroyed the central post office in Jamaica. However, in the interim a petition bearing 14 valid signatures for this transfer and a letter from Region 9 Director Ramiro Garcia indicating his approval of the transfer of the Jamaica Section to Region 3 have been received. (Attached)

With the receipt of the attached, it is requested that the IEEE Executive Committee and Board of Directors approve proposed revisions to IEEE Bylaw 401.2 transferring the Jamaica Section from Region 9 to Region 3.

ACTION: The IEEE Executive Committee and Board of Directors to approve proposed revisions to IEEE Bylaw 401.2 as recommended by RAB.

PROPOSED REVISIONS TO IEEE BYLAW 401.2 - REGIONS

Current

401.2

The United States of America shall be divided into six Regions. The territory comprising Canada shall be Region 7. Region 8 shall consist of Africa, Europe, Greenland, Iceland, the Union of Soviet Socialist Republics, and the Near and Middle East countries located west of Afghanistan and Pakistan. The territory comprising the Caribbean and Bahama Islands, South America, Central America and North America (except the United States and Canada) shall be designated Region 9. Areas not included in Regions 1 through 9 shall be designated Region 10. The boundaries of the Regions shall be established by the Board of Directors.

Proposed Revision

401.2

The United States of America shall be divided into six Regions. Region 1 shall cover Northeastern USA. Region 2 shall cover Eastern USA. Region 3 shall cover Southeastern USA and shall also embrace the Island of Jamaica as a part of its territory. Region 4 shall cover Central USA. Region 5 shall cover Southwestern USA. Region 6 shall cover Western USA. The territory comprising Canada shall be Region 7. Region 8 shall consist of Africa, Europe, Greenland, Iceland, the Union of Soviet Socialist Republics, and the Near and Middle East countries located west of Afghanistan and Pakistan. The territory comprising the Caribbean and Bahama Islands, South America, Central America and North America (except the United States, Jamaica and Canada) shall be designated Region 9. Areas not included in Regions 1 through 9 shall be designated Region 10. The boundaries of the Regions shall be established by the Board of Directors.

Jamaica Section Background - Part II

Jamaica has not filed a meeting report for 1982. Assuming they held the required minimum 5 meetings, their total 1982/83 Rebate would be \$613.50. It is interesting to note there were 28 higher grade new elections in 1982, a high proportion out of 91 higher grade members.

Because of airfare structures, travel to a Region 9 meeting in Panama City, Panama would apparently be somewhat ~~less~~ (\$270 est.) than would travel to a Region 3 meeting in Atlanta (\$314 est.) (Both figures assume an excursion coach fare ticket booked well in advance.)

Estimated cost of sending 10 monthly newsletters to each of 100 Jamaican members, from a Region 3 Section (Miami?) is about \$500 per year. (Cost is 37¢ airmail postage, plus printing, handling, labels for total of 50¢ per issue). (Alternative is to add Jamamica Chairman to mailing lists of some Region 3 units and he propagates info somehow. He currently receives the monthly Bonzi Region 9 Leadership newsletter - in Spanish.)

Effect on Regional Rebate would be estimated as negligible (10¢ per member and \$10 per Section remain the same, difference is airfare, about \$50). As long as the Regional rebate earned was paid to the Region servicing Jamaica, rather than the statistical parent, funding would seem equitable. However, if a Region 3 newsletter (Miami?) were sent, it would probably be reasonable to somehow collect the cost (\$5) from each Jamaican member on the mailing list. This could be done Section-wide or as an option to each Jamaican member, or in bulk to the Section Chairman for handing out.

The ^{two} options at this point, other than status quo, seem to be:

- A) Jamaica moves lock stock-and GEOCODE to Region 3. Statistically counted in Region 3, Region 3 gets rebate.

Many difficulties to overcome using this approach. Some are:

- USAB programs may not be applicable nor worthwhile to Jamaicans.
- Annual cost of IEEE Membership would jump 27% with Region 3 (USAB) assessment added.


- B) Jamaica "audits" Region 3 activities, Region 3 compensated for expenses, but Region 9 maintains statistical and administrative possession:

- To be a "test", for X years. Reassess situation yearly.
- Primarily an experiment in increased communication. Even if aware of activities, Jamaicans may not choose/be able to participate.

CONCLUSION: Recommend Option B, after thorough consideration by parties involved.

Opinion is that this situation, due to geography and language, cannot be resolved economically to everyone's adequate level of satisfaction.
