# **CHAIRMAN'S REPORT**

The 1962-1963 season may be termed the "Season of the Merger". As of January 1, 1963, the American Institute of Electrical Engineers (AIEE) and the Institute of Radio Engineers (IRE) officially merged to form the Institute of Electrical and Electronic Engineers (IEEE). As a result, the Lynn Section AIEE became the Lynn-Subsection of the Boston Section IEEE, thus ending the section status of Lynn which had existed for more than half a century.

The decision to become a Sub-section of Boston rather than maintain section status was decided by unanimous vote of the Executive Committee after intensive investigation showed that the best interests of the membership could be served by becoming a Sub-section of Boston.

The Lynn Sub-section will enjoy a membership of approximately 500 and will include the following towns and cities all located in Essex County: Beverly, Danvers, Lynn, Lynnfield, Marblehead, Nahant, Peabody, Salem, Saugus, and Swampscott.

New By-Laws for the Lynn Sub-section are nearing completion and will be presented to the membership for a vote at the first meeting of the coming season.

A regrettable note is that as a result of a National IEEE Headquarters ruling, the Popular Lecture Series can no longer be presented.

I wish to thank all officers and committee members for their dual effort required to bring the merger to a successful completion as well as for providing a most successful and enjoyable program. I would also like to thank all officers and committee members who in the past half-century-plus have given their dedicated service for the successful operation of the Lynn Section AIEE.

# REPORT OF THE MERRIMACK VALLEY SUBSECTION

Plans to form the Merrimack Valley Sub-section of the Lynn Section of the American Institute of Electrical Engineers were started in March of 1956. The election of officers was announced in June of 1956. Initially there were approximately 45 members. A gradual growth has resulted in approximately 100 institute members and 30 student members.

As of January 1, 1963 the American Institute of Electrical Engineers (AIEE) merged with the Institute of Radio Engineers (IRE) and became the Institute of Electrical and Electronic Engineers (IEEE). As a result of many meetings with Merrimack Valley Sub-section - IRE, Boston Section - IRE, Boston Section - AIEE, Lynn Section - AIEE and our Sub-section officers and membership, it has been agreed to merge with the Merrimack Valley Sub-section - IRE and become the Merrimack Valley Sub-section of the Boston Section - IEEE. The Sub-section will have approximately 600 institute members and 100 student members.
